

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A HIGH SHARE OF INPUTS COMING FROM THE U.S. IS A KEY CONTRIBUTOR TO VULNERABILITY...




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CANADA'S UNPRECEDENTED GDP DECLINE FOLLOWED BY A SHARP REBOUND

Canada's quarterly recession patterns, real GDP indexed to first quarter before each recession



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






INVENTORIES IS THE EASIEST WAY TO DEAL WITH SHORT-TERM DISRUPTIONS TO CRITICAL INPUTS


Canadian Manufacturing Inventories and U.S. Total Business Inventories



Domestic Project Announcements by U.S. Owned Enterprises As a Share of Total Project Announcements



Average Distance Travelled by Canadian Merchandise Imports


