Which ever method you use to make your hotel reservations at the Radisson-Warwick please be sure to use both our organizational name (I SQOLS) to obtain the special reduced conference rate of \$129 (single) or \$139 (double). (Note: On the Radisson hotel site, the hotel home page will prompt you to fill in the dates of your stay and, once entered, there will be an empty box on the same page labeled *Promotional Code*. In that box, enter I SQOLS and the special promotional rates for the conference will appear).

Reservations made at the conference hotel include a full American breakfast for each day of your stay and access to reduced parking in selected garages (parking arrangements must be arranged in advance of arrival). Hotel reservations must be made by not later than October 20, 2004 and be guaranteed by a personal credit card. Cancellations must be made prior to 4:00 PM on the day of arrival.

Hotel Location and Transportation to the Hotel: Philadelphia has a wide range of inexpensive transportation between the airport and Center City and Pennsylvania Train Station (30th Street) and Center City.

Persons arriving with at the airport with heavy luggage probably will want to take a taxi (approximately \$35.00 each way) or a shuttle (approximately \$15.00 each way) to the hotel. Both types of transportation can be arranged following arrival in Philadelphia at the <u>Transportation Desk</u> located in the <u>Arrivals Lounge</u> close to where you will retrieve your luggage.

Alternatively, the Airport runs an express train from the airport to center city Philadelphia (the SEPTA "R-1" High Speed Rail Line). The train is accessible from the pedestrian bridge and also from the baggage pickup center. Among other stops, the train will take you to 16th and Pennsylvania Ave (Suburban Station) and, from there, is a 10-15 minute walk to the Radisson-Warwick Hotel. The cost of the train is approximately \$9.00 each way.

Once situated in the hotel, Philadelphia has a wide network of comparatively inexpensive transportation offering connections throughout the Metro Philadelphia community. Maps, schedule and cost information may be obtained from the hotel Concierge following your arrival. The transportation grid also will connect you with trains and buses to other areas of the Northeastern U.S., e.g., to New York City (2 hours), Washington DC (2 hours).

CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS

In cooperation with the University of Pennsylvania School of Social Work continuing education units (CEUs) may be available to American registrants who are either *Licensed Social Workers* or *National Certified Counselors* (NBCC). Up to a maximum of 16 CEUs may be granted to social workers licensed in Pennsylvania; social workers licensed in states other than Pennsylvania should contact their State licensing board to determine whether and how many CEU's granted by the University of Pennsylvania School of Social Work are acceptable for licensure renewal within that state.

ADDITIONAL CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

CULTURAL EVENING

The evening of Friday, November 12th has been set aside as a "cultural evening." Planned activities include your choice of: a) a no-host (i.e., self pay) **musical performance** in one of Philadelphia major arts centers (e.g., the Academy of Music, a jazz club, etc.); b) a no-host **dramatic performance**; c) a no-host **Chinese, Moroccan or Colonial Philadelphia** banquet in Philadelphia's historic Center City; or, d) hosted **home-hospitality** with a QOL colleague living in the metropolitan Philadelphia community. In most cases, participants will need to cover the cost of transportation and, in the case of no-host banquet events, dinner costs. Hosted dinners will be provided at no cost to a limited number of pre-registrants for these dinners.

POST CONFERENCE TOURS

A rich offering of post-conference cultural/QOL tours have been planned for participants. These include half-day tours to major arts and cultural institutions and many other venues in and around the Greater Philadelphia area. Half-day tours are scheduled for Saturday (November 13, 2004) immediately following lunch and full-day tours are scheduled for Sunday (November 14, 2004) following a leisurely breakfast. All tours will be provided "at cost" to participants, i.e., participants will be responsible for their transportation and, where required, admission costs to museums and other venues. The special conference rate of \$129 (singles) and \$139 (doubles) at the Radisson-Warwick has been extended for an additional night's stay to accommodate registrants who wish to participate in the post-conference cultural tours. This additional night, though, must be booked as part of the original reservation.

Workshops: Workshops provide a "hands on" opportunities for researchers and practitioners to enhance their skills in QOL assessment and measurement. WK3: QOL Assessment of Persons with Chronic Illness or Disability. This workshop will provide an understanding of the 'Quality of Life' (QOL) concept which underpins the construction of QOL measures. Existing conventional approaches and measures such as Health-related QOL, which are adopted in health care to ascertain the QOL of people with chronic illness or disability will be reviewed. An alternative and contemporary approach using Subjective Wellbeing (SWB), and The International Wellbeing Index, a recently developed and well empirically tested SWB measure will be introduced. The essential differences between these different approaches and measures will be examined and discussed. Important practical issues or factors which should be considered in QOL measurements in health care will be highlighted. Registration is limited to 20 participants. (Half Day—10:00-1:00. Cost: \$75 members/\$110 non-members).

A comprehensive approach will be used to identify methods for assessing the QOL of the elderly in relation to: a) social well-being; b) physical well-being; c) psychological well-being; d) cognitive well-being; e) spiritual well-being; and f) environmental well-being. The workshop facilitators will emphasize the importance of the following factors that contribute to the QOL among the aged: a) characteristics of environment; b) in assisted living and other structured living environments, the characteristics of staff, care, and assistance; c) social relations and activities; and d) opportunities for choice. CONCURRENT PAPER SESSIONS, ROUNDTABLES AND POSTER SESSIONS

Abstracts have been accepted for presentation as "papers" (typically a maximum of 10-15 minutes in length), "roundtables" (typically 60 minutes with 1 presenter and an audience of 8-9 persons who share a deep interest in the topic being presented), or as "poster" sessions (scheduled during coffee breaks and, thus, potentially attracting a "large" but, mobile, audience).

Concurrent Paper Sessions: Limited to 3-4 topically-focused presentations in a 1.5 hour time slot. Most sessions will be limited to a maximum of 3 presentations and, depending on the track, a discussant. Hence, each presenter will be restricted to 15 minutes + 10 minutes for the discussant + at least 15-20 minutes for questions, answers and other types of interaction with the audience.

Roundtables: One-hour long sessions following breakfast with 1-2 presenters and 6-8 participants.

Poster Sessions: Single presentations made during scheduled during coffee breaks. Time: 30 minutes with a rotating audience.
